Based on those principles AAE has defined a standard for Code of Conduct for the actuaries which is applied also in Finland. The Code wouldn't be effective without proper disciplinary processes in place. Roseanne Harris will discuss the principles of professionalism and what does it mean in practice.</i></p>
